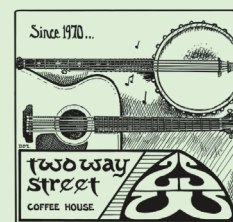

Paul Tyler (above left) is a fiddler, folklorist and musicologist who teaches song and instrumental classes at the Old Town School, and anthropology at Wright College. A well-travelled square-dance caller, Paul has played and recorded with several bands, including the Volo Bogtrotters, and has written extensively on the history of traditional and country music.

Steve Rosen (above right) teaches banjo and fiddle at the Old Town School of Folk Music and plays bluegrass, country and old-time music for a living. Steve is a member of the Volo Bogtrotters string band and a mainstay of the Chicago Barn Dance Company. He plays banjo, mandolin, piano and guitar for dozens of dances every year.
