

CONCERT SERIES

The first year of the Plank Road's concert series at Sokol Hall was successful in all ways. We started out with the Jethro Burns quartet last fall and went on to present a wide variety of acoustic music that included, among other styles, blues, bluegrass, and Irish music to audiences of up to 180 folks. We also presented a special Christmas show with The More the Merrier, a children's concert with Art Thieme, and an end of the season festival featuring local performers.

We'd like to thank all those involved for their efforts, and especially Mary Nugent and Charlie Lewis, who coordinated the series, and all of you who came out and supported it. Plank Road added almost a hundred new members this year in large part due to attendance at our shows.

Plans for next year are already beginning, so if you have any suggestions on performers you'd like to see or other events you'd like to attend drop us a line at our P.O. box or talk to any one of the directors. We're also hoping that this coming year even more people will be able to take an active part in coordinating, publicizing, and organizing Plank Road events. Keeping a successful concert series going involves a lot of time and energy. We could really use people for the following "jobs:"

PUBLICITY COORDINATOR: Responsibilities include sending out press releases to newspapers, coordinating mailings to membership, preparing flyers for concerts and distribution. We'd be happy to show you the procedures for doing this, taking you through the process step by step.

CONCESSIONS COORDINATOR: This involves buying and storing the concessions we sell at each concert (soda, popcorn, etc.), and of course, getting the concessions to the events as well.

Volunteer Coordinator: This person would help with setting up the hall and would recruit other workers and show them what needs to be done during the evening, including counter help, set-up and tear down, and help at the door.

We're already planning next season's concerts, the first of which will be on SEPT. 10TH, and we'd appreciate any help you can give us.

...With summer here we can't forget Downers Grove Heritage Festival on June 24th, 25th, and 26th. Every year the streets near the Main Street train station are blocked off to provide room for entertainment, music, exhibits by various

local organizations, and lots and lots of food. Of special interest to folk music fans is the folk stage, located in Fishel Park behind the Two Way Street. From 10-6 you can see some of your favorite performers in an area that's far enough away from the other events so you can relax and hear easily but close enough that you can walk half a block and get a slice of pizza or see what's happening on the main stage. Check the Two Way Street schedule for a listing of specific performers.

You might also want to stop by on Friday night, the 24th, when Special Consensus will be playing out in front of the Two Way Street. This special show starts at 8:00, and is opened by Thursday's Child. And on Sunday, the 25th, keep a look out for Ripe for the Pickin' performing in the beer garden at noon...





In November of 1981 Mark Dvorak was one of the first performers to take the stage at the Old Quarter coffeehouse in Brookfield. At the time the Old Quarter was in St. Barbara's old parish gym and the stage wasn't really a stage at all but a rectangular area under the basketball net. The building was torn down a few months later and the coffeehouse moved next door to the church's Old School hall, just one of several moves it would make in the next few years. During those years Mark worked at presenting, promoting, and playing folk music in the western suburbs, contributing to the growth

of the Old Quarter and later becoming an active member of the Plank Road Society. At the same time he continued pursuing his own music.

Today Mark is a well known performer throughout the Midwest and beyond. In the past few months you could find him anywhere from Carefree, Arizona to Oregon, Illinois, and then back here at the Plank Road Folk Festival and down at the Old Town School where he teaches, performs, and hosts Mr. Coffeehouse. Now, this summer, Mark's first cassette album, "No Lonesome Tune," is being released on Depot Records. Also appearing on the album will be friends Marianne Mohrhusen, Lee Murdock, Dave Humphreys, Steve Budde, and Charlie Brown.

Where's the first place you can get the album? Right at the Two Way Street Coffee House on JULY 16TH in the big room down the hall from the regular coffeehouse. The time is 8:00 and admission is \$3. Plank Road's looking forward to this chance to see Mark perform again and to show our support for him and wish him success. We hope you can come out!

THE TENTH ANNUAL HIGHATHA MUSIC FESTIVAL

The 10th annual Hiawatha Traditional Music Festival will be held at the Tourist Park in Marquette, Michigan, the weekend of July 23rd, 24th, and 25th. This year's guest stars include Claudia Schmidt and Sally Rogers, Joel Mabus,

The Red Clay Ramblers, and more.

The festival kicks off Friday night with an old-fashioned dance under the stars. Saturday and Sunday will have featured acts plus two alternate stages for the many workshops. There is a third workshop area just for children; one of Sunday's highlights is the children's concert with their festival-made instruments.

Marquette itself is a beautiful college twon on the south shore of Lake Superior in Michigan's Upper Peninsula. Within the city limits are sand beaches, bike trails, historical museums, waterfalls, lighthouses, and virgin forests. The Pictured Rocks National Lakeshore, with more waterfalls and spectacular cliffs and sand dunes, is centered in Munising, only 40 miles east of Marquette.

If camping at the festival site is not your cup of tea, Marquette has many reasonably priced motels. This is the height of the tourist season, though, so it makes sense to make reservations ahead of time.

A weekend pass for the whole festival is \$20 (\$15 if you buy it in advance). There are reduced rates for teens and seniors, and children under 12 are free. This will be my 5th Hiwatha festival and I've enjoyed them more each year. If you would like more information feel free to call me at 848-1654.

FOX VALLEY EVENTS

You drive down Route 38 west from Chicago all the way to Geneva, Illinois, stopping just before the bridge that arches over the river. You park the car, unload coolers, blankets, instruments, and children, and stroll under the bridge (if you can stroll with all of that to carry) and along the beautiful Fox River, following a paved bike trail into Island Park. Where are you? The Fox Valley Folk Festival, of course.

This year marks the 11th annual Fox Valley Fest on September 4th and 5th. As you walk in you'll see four stages set up—a main concert stage, a storytelling stage, and two workshop stages. Plenty of food will be available (you can also bring your own, but no alcohol, please), and a lot of good music both on and off stage, so bring your own instruments and take part in the informal jam sessions that seem to spring up everywhere around the park.

Performers this year will include Doug and Bonnie Miller; Gaping Mau; Phil Cooper, Margaret Nelson, and Paul Goelz; Lee Murdock and more. Admission is Just \$7, and camp sites near the festival are available. Island Park is located on Route 38 and the Fox River in Geneva, Illinois.



Leaders will coach the groups in areas that the group members need or want to cover, such as:

Private lessons in guitar, banjo, fiddle, mandolin, hammered and lap dulcimer, bass, plus lessons in instrument kit building and instrument repair. Daytime lessons are also available.

- 1. How to make the most of your skill (shaky to advanced) by playing with pickers at your own level. Learn when to play and when not to play; how to balance a group.
- 2. Using your ear to identify chords and recognize chord patterns and progressions.
- 3. Tips on tuning fiddles, guitars, banjoes, mandolins & basses, etc., together quickly in real time.
- 4. For singers, working up harmony in 2, 3 and 4 parts.
- 5. Customs, conventions and courtesies of singarounds, parking lot pickin' and parlour picking.




