THE BLUEGRASS BUG by Larry Robinson

Bluegrass music is another facet of the general term "folk music." The term "Bluegrass" originally meant the music of Bill Monroe, who is regarded as the father of bluegrass music, and a native of Kentucky (the Bluegrass State!). The music now has an international appeal.

Bluegrass music is relatively young; it had it's official birth in 1946 with the Monroe band of Lester Flatt (guitar) and Earl Scruggs (banjo). The music is rooted in the traditions of Scotch-Irish tunes, English ballads and the Negro blues. Incidentally, the first recorded bluegrass music was done at the Columbia studios in Chicago.

The instrumental makeup of the traditional bluegrass band consists of a mandolin, banjo, guitar, fiddle and acoustic bass. An electric bass is permitted in some bands, and you might find a dobro in some bands, too. All of this is highlighted by very tight harmony vocals. The only reason for the acoustic nature of the instruments is that the founding musicians lived in areas where there was no electricity.

Bluegrass has been called, "folk music in overdrive," "hillbilly jazz" and the "purest form of American music." All of these terms are accurate to some degree, depending on which particular artists you are listening to. That, for me, is the appeal of the music. It offers something for everyone.

The Sandwich Bluegrass Music Weekend offers a good cross section of the various aspects of bluegrass music. The stage show is just part of the entertainment. the parking lot picking goes on all night, so bring your instruments.

The camping area at the fair grounds are a delight with all of the large, old oak trees--so plan on spending the weekend.

Be prepared to meet and pick with some of the nicest people you'll ever have the pleasure of knowing. You'll be looking forward to your next festival after you get bitten by "the bluegrass bug."

PLANK ROAD'S 2nd ANNUAL CAMP OUT & SONG FEST PLANNED FOR JULY 17-19

The Plank Road Folk Music Society has set July 17-19 for the 2nd Annual Camp Out and Song Fest at Hi-Tide Campground in Leland, Illinois. Leland is located just an hour west of Downers Grove.

"Last summer's camp out and song fest was a complete success. There was plenty of for the kids to do, lots of informal music-making and it provided for a relaxing get-away weekend for those who attended." says Plank road President Paul Klonowski. "I'd like to extend an invitation to all members of the Plank Road Folk Music Society, their friends and their familys to join us for the weekend."

Activities will include two days of light camping, relaxing, good gab, swimming, hiking, fishing, horse shoes, croquet, volleyball and songs & tunes with good friends. The facilities at Hi-Tide include a group of tent camping sites (some have electric and water), nice ceramic tiled bathrooms with full showers (hot water optional), a pool and hot tub (seriously!) and a small swimming lake (w/life guard).

A general store for food, supplies, firewood & ice is located on the grounds (complete w/laundry facilities) and a fenced in playground is available for children. There is also good fishing in Little Indian Creek.

Hi-Tide Campground is just a one hour drive west of Downers Grove, IL. From the EAST travel 4 miles west of Somonauk on Rt. 34 to the junction of Rt. 34 and Rt. 23's north leg. When 23 passes south of 34, it becomes Hi-Tide Road. Take Hi-Tide Rd. South 1 mile to Campground.

From the NORTH take Rt. 23 South from I-88 (DeKalb Exit). When 23 passes south of 34, it become Hi-Tide Road. Take Hi-Tide Road south 1 mile to campground.

The cost is \$13.00 per day, per site (or \$26 for 2 days). A site can be occupied by 1 family OR 2 adults & 2 kids OR 3 adults. A limited number of sites have been reserved. PLANK ROAD TO ASSIST SUMMER FESTIVALS

The Plank Road Folk Music Soceity has an active summer planned, providing volunteer support, planning input and entertainment at three area music events.

The Plank Road information booth and Plank Road volunteers will be on hand for the Downers Grove Heritage Festival's Two Way Street Stage, in Fishel Park (right behind the 1st Congregational Church) on Saturday, June 27th from 10:30-6 pm.

The Two Way Street stage features musicians and performers who have been featured at the popular Two Way Street Coffeehouse throughout the year.

On July 11 & 12, Plank Road will be volunteering as an organization at the 4th Annual Warrenville Folk Festival. Volunteers have already participated in several planning meetings for the festival, and will also staff the two day event as stage & tech assistants, concession and album sales people, workshop leaders and stage management.

"For years we've helped out at the Two Way Street Stage at Downers Grove's Heritage Festival," says Plank Road President Paul Klonowski, "and we've discussed over and over whether Plank Road should sponsor it's own summer music event. We decided it would be more effective for our organization to act as a support to the great festivals already sponsored by the Two Way Street, and now the Warrenville Folk Society. We're very proud to be taking part."

Along with the Save the Prairie Society and the Palos Restoration Project, Plank Road will be celebrating the past, present and future of Cook County Forest Preserves and Natural areas at Pulaski Woods West (95th Street & Wolf Road) at the 1st ever Wilderness Day on Sunday, August 23 from 11 am - 6 pm.

"Plank Road has agreed to supply and schedule the entertainment for this very important event, " says Klonowski. "We feel that folk music can compliment and help sustain these types of organizations and projects like Wilderness Day. We want to invite every Plank Road member to help celebrate our own natural resources right here in Cook County.


