Cindy Mangsen & Steve Gilette return for Jones Studio House Concert on April 23rd

The Jones Family Music Studio and the Plank Road Folk Music Society will present a very special HOUSE **CONCERT** featuring Cindy Mangsen and Steve Gillette on Saturday, April 23 at 8 pm at the Jones Family Music Studio, 36 Hickory, Lombard.

Mangsen and Gillette have been touring together for the past several years after enjoying successful solo careers. Cindy Mangsen began her singing career right in Chicago and earned wide spread respect for her thoughtful and beautiful arrangements of traditional ballads. She is a brilliant guitarist, banjo player and concertina player, but it is her singing, her songs and concert performances that have ranked her as one of the nations top

traditional singers.

As a performer, award winning song writer Steve Gillette has recorded six solo albums, at many major folk festivals, toured in 31 countries and inspired glowing reviews from critics and fierce loyalty from his fans. As a songwriter, he is among the finest. Among the distinguished artists who have recorded his work are John Denver, The Nitty Gritty Dirt Band, Dave Dudley, Mickey Gilley, Ian and Sylvia, Waylon Jennings, Gordon Lightfoot, Anne Murray, Linda Ronstadt, Spanky and Our Gang, Mel Tillis, Bobby Vinton, Jerry Jeff Walker and Jennifer Warnes. His film credits include writing and singing the title theme from Walt Disney's "The Pond" and M.G.M.'s "The Outfit." He has also written songs for the Walt disney characters Jiminy Crickett, Dumbo, Rainbow Brite and Winnie-the-Pooh.

Musicians wishing to sit in with the All Volunteer Stringband at Plank Road Barn Dances are encouraged to take advantage of the Barn Dance rehearsals held the 2nd Saturday of each month at the Jones Family Music Studio, 36 E. Hickory, Lombard. Musicians will brush up on the standard fiddle tune repertoire and learn new tunes as well.

Below are some tips for musicians wishing to sit in with the band at barn dances:

- 1. Plan to arrive at least 15 minutes before the dance begins. This will allow time for tuning and to become acquainted with the other musicians and the program.
- 2. Check in with the fiddler in charge. You'll learn the best place to stand and who to watch if you need to "read" the chords.
- 3. It's important to play softly enough to hear the rhythm that the fiddle is making. It's important that the band strive to play together (the dancers will appreciate it!).
- 4. WATCH THE DANCERS! You'll get a good idea of the proper tempo by watching them and listening to the fiddler.

March 13th Michael Cooney shows: Two Thumbs Up!

Performing on voice, guitar, banjo, fretless banjo, concertina, 12 string guitar and jaw harp, Michael Cooney, showed audiences at the Two Way Street afternoon family show and the Sokol Hall evening concert why he is called "the one-man folk festival."

Cooney, who dropped out of high-school in 1963 to travel and sing folk songs, presented both crowds with a peek into the many worlds of folk song. From Lead Belly's powerful "Bourgeois Blues" to a light-hearted look at love between atoms to railroading's little-known but beautiful "Dummy Line" to the cowboy lament "Bury Me Not on the Lone Prairie," Cooney sang with grace and spoke with reverence for the vast body of folk song that has become his way of life and livelihood for the past 30 years.

His songs were the stars of the afternoon and evening shows. Cooney's greatness lies in his ability to capture the subtlety, power and humor contained in folk music; out of which he fashioned two absorbing and entertaining programs.
