The organizers and volunteers did a great job of decorating the gymnasium at the Community Center, transforming it into an old-time country barn, with bales of hay, quilts, a variety of antiques and the many donated scarecrows (which were later auctioned off) around the edges of the room. Several local vendors and crafters displayed their wares in the lobby, and visitors could stop by the bake sale and view a video about the Peck House. All in all, it was a splendid afternoon, with over \$2,000 raised for the Peck House.

The Lou & Peter Berryman Concert also was a wonderful evening! The Berryman's introduced Plank Road to a special trio from England named Artisan, who opened the concert with several numbers. Their beautiful accapella singing was spiced with a touch of wit and merriment. Artisan's music and wit greatly complimented Lou & Peter's special brand of music, and the audience left the show with a warm glow inside, and sore jaws from laughing so hard!! There was a great turn out, (with many non-Plank Roaders), record sales were good, and we even picked up

some new memberships. On the whole, the evening was a great success!


