Experience a musical melting pot when Plank Road presents **Jutta & the Hi-Dukes™** on **Saturday, May 2** at **8:00 PM** at the **Two Way Street Coffee House** in Downers Grove

When you mix three musicians; ten instruments (including violin, mandolin, guitar, kaval, dumbec, ocarina, penny whistle, sipsi, bass guitar and saxophone); music from twenty countries and vocals in sixteen languages, with energy and lots of audience interaction, things naturally start cooking! Jutta & the Hi-DukesTM are chefs in the world-music kitchen. Their unique recipes for a good time contain spicy ingredients like hot Greek, Balkan, Klezmer and Gypsy pieces as well as bittersweet Yiddish and Ladino songs and dashes of Scandinavian salt. For dessert, they serve up some of their own compositions. With an international menu like this, it is safe to say that Jutta & the Hi-DukesTM has something for every taste.

Since 1990 the group has been invited to present their special blend of music across the US, Canada and Europe, including the Winnipeg and the Earthsong festivals in Canada; the Bliss Fest, the Shawano Old Time Music Fest, the Spirits of the Woods Music Fest and the Fox Valley Folk Music and Storytelling Festival in America. They have toured Denmark three times. Other performances have been at clubs, dance parties, schools, business expositions and private events. In addition to being recording artists on the Flying Fish and Modal Music labels, Jutta & the Hi-DukesTM members have performed on TV and radio. The Illinois Arts Council also

accepted the group to be Illinois Artists in residence from 1994 through 1998.

Jutta & the Hi-Dukes™ will be presenting a concert for the first part of the evening, followed by a dance featuring Eastern European style music for the second half. Admission is \$10, general; \$8 for PRFMS members. Join us for this very special evening of music and dance!

Downer's Grove honors one of Plank Road's own!

A hearty congratulations goes out to Dave Humphreys, Plank Road board member and director of the Two Way Street Coffee House! Dave was awarded the 1997 Citizen of the Year by the Downers Grove Area Chamber of Commerce and Industry.

We all know how much we benefit from Dave's enthusiasm and encouragement at Plank Road. However, many of you may not be aware that he is currently a member of the Community Events Commission, the Downers Grove Library Board and the Downers Grove Visitors Bureau board. In the past, he has served on the Hotel Tax Advisory Board, the Economic Development Task Force, the DuPage County Mental Health Advisory Committee and was president of the DuPage County Board of Health. In addition to being founder and director of the Two Way Street Coffee House, and member of the board of directors of Plank Road Folk Music Society, Dave is also on the board of directors and serves as treasurer for North American Folk Music & Dance Alliance. Dave is also the current moderator (in effect the head officer) of the First Congregational Church of Downers Grove UCC.

In all, Dave Humphreys devotes more than 30 hours a week to his various activities, which are all volunteer positions. On those rare moments when he is not in touch with his community, or freelancing on the local music scene as a stand-up bassist, Dave is in touch with nature, backpacking through the Canadian Rockies. What has made all of his volunteer work possible is that he was offered early retirement from IBM, where he sold mainframe computers to corporations for 27 years.

"I have more time available now, so I'm doing more things," he said. "Now I am able to do a lot of volunteer stuff and supplement it with music." Dave stresses the importance of people donating time to good causes. "Volunteerism is a very important thing in our society. Our heritage was built on volunteerism. There's an awful lot of very important work that if it weren't for volunteers, it wouldn't get done." In response to this award, Dave said "I'm very honored and humbled. I'm grateful to receive this honor from my peers, people I know and consider my friends and associates. They're doing the same thing I'm doing—volunteering."

Last January, Plank Roaders gathered at the Lombard Park District's Log Cabin for our Annual Meeting. We gathered around the fireplace and after conducting a brief business meeting, spent the rest of the evening playing music, visiting with friends old and new and sampling goodies at the snack table!
