Festival Season is Upon Us!

Here it is, June, already! Festival season is here!! Hope you all have your instruments tuned, voices warmed up; tunes ready to share and are ready to pick up new ones. Included in this newsletter is a Festival and Summer Event Listing, but I thought you might like some highlights:

Heritage Festival is on June 26, 27 & 28. As you can see from the front page, there is a lot of great stuff in store for us this year! Anne Hills, Steve Gillette & Cindy Mangsen, and the Volo Bogtrotters will be featured 8:00 PM to 10:00 PM on Friday night, in a song circle format: playing with each other, by themselves and/or in various combinations. This is the first time they have all been on stage together, so this should be a real treat! Saturday will have the Folk Festival from 10:00 AM to 5:30 PM in Fishel Park (see the listing on the front cover for who will be there!), followed by a concert by the James Keelaghan Band from 5:30 PM to 7:30 PM, back on Curtiss Street in front of the Two Way Street Coffee House. Sunday from 3:00 PM to 5:30 PM will be the Family Barn Dance with Marianne Mohrhusen calling and music provided by the Salt Creek Ramblers.

July 11 and 12 is a busy weekend, with both Warrenville Folk Festival in downtown Warrenville, IL, and Gebhard Woods Dulcimer Festival at Gebhard Woods State Park in Morris, IL. Both festivals have a great line-up of performers, as well as many opportunities for workshops, jamming, and perusing the booths of many vendors from across the Midwest with instruments, books, tapes, etc. For details on who's playing, etc., see the Festival Listing in the center of the QN. Other great opportunities are the Woodstock Folk Festival, on July 19; the Lake County Folk Festival on August 2. In September, there's the Fox Valley Folk Festival on Sept. 6 & 7, as well as the Chinquapin Folk Music & Storytelling Festival on September 11 & 12. For those of you who like Storytelling, many of these festivals include storytelling events, but the Illinois Storytelling Festival on July 25 & 26 is devoted entirely to storytelling. For you Bluegrass fans, there is the Sandwich Bluegrass Festival on June 19, 20 & 21, and the Schaumburg Bluegrass Music and Family Fun Days on June 27 & 28. Check the center page for details!

Don't forget about the Plank Road Campout, August 7, 8 & 9, at White Pines Forest State Park in Mt. Morris, IL. We plan on the usual—playing around the campfire on Friday and Saturday nights, with hiking, fishing, canoeing, informal jamming, etc. during the day on Saturday. There are lots of options, and the important part is to relax and enjoy time with friends! If you aren't coming for the weekend, plan on joining us for the day on Saturday! 


