

Carrie Newcomer comes to Plank Road!



"To my mind – a writer's eye – Carrie Newcomer is much more than a musician. She's a poet, storyteller, snake-charmer, good neighbor, friend and lover, minister of the wide-eyed gospel of hope and grace. All this, and she comes with a voice that declares: 'Sit down here a minute and listen.' Who could ask for more?" – Barbara Kingsolver, author of The Poisonwood Bible and The Bean Trees.

There is a tendency to equate progress with expansion. The illusion persists that, in order to achieve deep emotional, social, or political impact, one must create works laden with girth and vast, cosmic meaning. As a songwriter, activist, mother, and teacher, Carrie Newcomer has fashioned a fulfilling life and career (the two become ever more inseparable with time) in defiance of that menacing principle. With each album, each collection of vivid, sterling songs, Newcomer pulls back one more of life's layers. Her

search reveals that what is considered universal and mighty is merely the sum of smaller things – moments so common that they are taken for granted. Carrie Newcomer captures those fleeting seconds, giving them their chance to shine as an equal part of life's essential fabric.

Newcomer's influence manifests itself in a more direct manner as well – as a mentor to young songwriters. "I've been working as an artist-in-residence and teaching workshops at colleges and spiritual retreats, like the Grünewald Guild, a camp for the arts in Leavenworth, Washington," she says. Connecting with her audiences is crucial to Newcomer. Starting this August, she is inaugurating the Gathering Book Group – an online discussion group centered around a different book each month. For Carrie, art does not exist in a vacuum – it becomes more vibrant when it impacts peoples lives, when it resonates as something true. The book group is an extension of this belief, as she seeks to introduce novice and seasoned readers alike to some of the works that have most affected her.

Similar outreach efforts, coupled with the power and sincerity of her music, have bridged the gap between Carrie and her fans, in a most tangible way. "Last album tour, after every show someone would come up and tell me a story. Funny stories, tragic stories, deeply personal stories, all of which they relate to my songs. I'm often humbled by the generosity people have shown me consistently. It was very affirming. Like most artists, I sometimes I ask myself "What am I doing?" and those stories reminded me. They seemed to say, This is what you're doing."

Carrie's approach to music embodies what Plank Road is all about. She performed at the Old Quarter Coffeehouse and is as glad to be helping us celebrate this special year as we are to have her back! "Our goal is to give songwriters specific ideas and concrete advice on improving their craft and promoting their work," said Steve Moss, Tunesmith Monthly's author and editor. "Like any art form, songwriting is a continuous learning process," said Jenny Moss, who contributes graphic design and layout to the project. "We aim to provide valuable information to writers of many different levels of experience."

Past issues have included tips on finding more time to write, getting inspiration, registering copyrights, and the basics of music theory. Tunesmith Monthly has also featured interviews with great songwriters like Peter Berryman and Fred Koller.

Steve & Jenny Moss are songwriters, performers, and Plank Road members based in Brookfield, IL. Their critically acclaimed debut CD <u>One Foot on the Train</u> was released in June of 2000.


