Scottish born, Canadian singer-songwriter David Francey and Montreal guitarist Dave Clarke promise an evening of entertainment you will never forget. When you hear Francey's music, you will understand why he won the 2002 Canadian JUNO award (that's Canadian for "Grammy") in the Folk/Roots category and why the Toronto Star says David Francey is one of Canada's most revered folk poets and singers. His songs are now being performed across North America by other artists. Choirs are also performing his works, and classrooms across Canada are teaching his songs to school children.

Dave Clarke is worth the price of admission alone. Dave has been called one of Canada's finest bluegrass pickers for his work with Steel Rail and the legendary Quebec group, the White River Bluegrass Band. His versatile and sensitive guitar arrangements provide the musical bedrock for Francey's strong original material and powerful vocals. Dave is an exquisite guitarist!



Mail reservations must be received seven days in advance of the camping date to insure the reservation. A daily lottery will be conducted for mail-in reservations. Up to six mail-in reservations per envelope, per person will be accepted for campsites or shelters. Camping groups may mail more than six reservations per envelope as long as no more than six are for one individual. A specific site may be reserved if it is located in the reserved campground. A site may be reserved for a maximum of 14 nights. Reservations will be held until 3 p.m. of the day following the first night's reservation. A reserved camp site must be vacated by 3 p.m. on the last day of the reservation period.

COSTS

The reservation fee is \$5.00 plus the first night's fee for each camp site reserved. All parks including Starved Rock are collecting the first night's camping fee. This \$5.00 reservation fee is non-refundable unless the campground is closed by the Department of Natural Resources. Payment for reservations must be confirmed by the site. The site will mail a confirmation notice to person making reservations. The \$5.00 fee is in addition to the regular camping and utility fees. Regular camping


